To all Citizens of Kinney County:

The purpose of our communication is to provide factual information concerning the COVID-19 virus to all citizens. Additionally, our focus is to keep all citizens within Kinney County safe and healthy. As of the publication of letter, there are zero confirmed cases within Kinney County. We want to encourage our people to stay home as much as possible. In the instance people have to leave their homes, please practice social distancing. At this point, there is not a shelter in place for Kinney County.

How to Protect Yourself and Others

The Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC) offers various strategies in an effort to slow the spread of the COVID-19 virus. Below are some general guidelines:

- Clean your hands often
 - Wash your hands often with soap and water for at least 20 seconds
 - ➤ If soap and water are not available, use a hand sanitizer that contains at least 60% alcohol
 - Avoid touching your eyes, nose, and mouth with unwashed hands
- Avoid close contact
 - Avoid close contact with people who are sick
 - > Put distance between yourself and other people
- Stay home if you are sick
- Cover coughs and sneezes
 - > Cover your mouth and nose with disposable tissue
 - Wash your hands immediately
- Wear a facemask if you are sick
- Clean and disinfect frequently touched surfaces daily
 - An option to disinfect is to dilute bleach; to make bleach solution:
 - 5 tablespoons $(1/3^{rd} \text{ cup})$ bleach per gallon of water
 - 4 teaspoons bleach per quart of water
